After reading Colossians 1:15-20 and Colossians 2:9, what do you think of Jesus?

Day Six: Read Colossians yet again (all of it in one setting)

Colossians 3:15-17 is extremely powerful. For us to accomplish everything described in Colossians 3:1-14, we need to have Jesus 'dwell richly' in us...
